A reminder that the IUGS Nominating Committee invited all the IUGS Adhering and Affiliate Organizations and Commissions to submit proposals for candidates for each office within the IUGS Executive Committee for its next term 2012-2016. Elections of nominated candidates will take place during the IUGS meeting at the 34th International Geological Congress in Brisbane, Australia, in August 2012. Candidates may also be nominated by the Nominating Committee. The deadline for submission of nominations to the IUGS Secretariat has been extended to 31 January, 2012. The Nominating Committee in particular encourages parts of the world that have not been represented in the Executive Committee for a long time to try to identify good candidates from their region.

ICSU'S NEW STRATEGIC PLAN PUBLISHED

Approved by the International Council for Science (ICSU) 30th General Assembly in Rome on November 23, 2011, the full text of the ICSU Strategic Plan II, 2012-2017 is now available via their Insight newsletter of November 2011. Like its predecessor, this Second Strategic Plan lays out how ICSU intends to build on the strengths of its global network of international disciplinary Unions, National Member organizations, and strategic partners, to address key issues for science and society over the coming medium term. This Second Strategic Plan builds on the successes and lessons learned from the past, and seeks to anticipate and address some of the major challenges for the future. It defines the operating space for ICSU during the next six-year period while at the same time leaving

room for new ideas and areas to be nurtured and developed. It includes a summary of achievements – including the completion and launching of new global initiatives – during the period 2006-2011. The 51-page Plan is the result of an extensive consultation and planning process among the ICSU membership, headed by the ICSU Committee on Scientific Planning and Review (CSPR). IRDR CONFERENCE ON DISASTER RISK REPORT IN LATEST IUGG E-JOURNAL

An overview of the ICSU program of The Integrated Research on Disaster Risk (IRDR) inaugural conference held in Beijing, China, (October 31 to November 2, 2011) has been posted in the IUGG Electronic Journal Volume 11 No. 12 (1 December 2011). The IRDR is a new ICSU ten-year program (<http://www.icsu.org/what-we-do/interdisciplinary-bodies/irdr>). The first IRDR Conference was conceived to respond to two fundamental questions: (i) why, despite advances in the natural and social science of hazards and disasters, do losses continue to increase?; and (ii) to what extent is the world-wide growth in disaster losses a symptom and indicator of unsustainable development? In addition to these questions the Conference focused on the most important problems related to the reduction of disaster risk and examined the characterization of hazards, vulnerability, and risk; and understanding decision-making in complex and changing risk contexts. The aim of the newly founded Short Courses on African Metallogeny program is to train young African geoscientists in the specific field of metallogeny, i.e. practical aspects of the genesis of ore deposits that can be applied in the formulation of future exploration strategies. These short courses are planned to be conducted on an annual basis in different parts of the African continent and are being organized by the Society for Geology Applied to Mineral Deposits (SGA), in collaboration with the The Institute of Development Research (IRD), and Teng Tuuma Geoservices, and supported by UNESCO, IUGS, the Society of Economic Geologists (SEG) and the Geological Society of Africa (GSA). Due to a particularly strong interest in exploration of the West African Craton, as evidenced for example by the West African Exploration Initiative (WAXI), The 1st SGA-SEG-UNESCO-IUGS Short Course on African Metallogeny will be held in Ouagadougou, Burkina Faso, from 12 to 18 March 2012 with the theme “Precious and Not-so-precious Metals in Old Cratons”.
